Under this agreement, Northumberland County will provide support to CMH Human Resource staff in areas such as labour relations, pay equity/compensation, benefit administration, disability case management, performance management and workplace investigations.

"Shared services are a strategic focus for Northumberland County Council as a means of driving innovation and efficiency in the use of resources for meeting the needs of our community," says Acting County Warden Bob Sanderson. "Council encourages staff to explore partnerships with municipal counterparts, as well as those in the broader public sector across Northumberland, that will maximize public investments, increase organizational capacity, and reinforce the public good. The County is pleased to be collaborating with CMH on this shared service initiative as another opportunity to deliver value to residents."
