





## Message to our community from CMH President and CEO, Varouj Eskedjian

We are now fully into the second wave of COVID, and while we know a vaccine is here, in terms of presence in Ontario, there is no confirmed timeline for the vaccine to arrive in our local area. The situation is fluid, and we are working with our local health unit to plan for the arrival of the vaccine in this area.
