CMH Community Steps Up at a Critical Time

Shortly after the COVID-19 outbreak began to take hold in Ontario it became apparent it would place unprecedented demands on all hospitals, including Campbellford Memorial Hospital (CMH). CMH quickly developed a list of medical equipment it needed immediately to take on the challenge of the pandemic and provide for the future health care for the community. The CMH Foundation responded and launched the Support the Effort Campaign to help raise the funds needed for the purchase of the urgently needed equipment. The list included room sterilization and isolation tools, thermometers, patient beds and lifts, personal protective equipment and much more.

At the time of the campaign launch Chief of Staff Dr. Bruce Bain said, "These are unprecedented times for all of us and the battle against COVID-19 will require effort on everyone's part through physical distancing and staying at home as much as possible. Those of us at CMH are working with unreserved determination to help those in our community that need our care whether related to COVID-19 or not. This will not be an easy fight but our team is in it for the duration."

Dr. Bain added, "Donor support is urgently needed. Please consider a gift to the **Support the Effort Campaign**. Your donations will be directed toward the Hospitals' highest priority needs during this challenging time. Together, we are stronger when we each do our part!"

Since the launch of the **Support the Effort Campaign**, the CMH community has shown unprecedented support with donations totaling over \$200,000 used to fund the purchases of essential lifesaving equipment and technology the hospital has required during the pandemic and beyond.

CHAIR AND CEO REPORT AGM 2019/20

To paraphrase a trailer that has been getting some traction in the media lately, the Universe started with a bang and so did Campbellford Memorial Hospital in 2019/20!

Investments in partnerships, people, the physical plant, medical equipment and patient safety initiatives were made possible through:

- one-time operating funding of \$5 million that enabled the hospital to eliminate its longstanding debt and begin the development of long-term plans to address operating, capital and infrastructure requirements for a revitalized role in a transformed health care system. One such development was the transformation of the operating rooms into a centre of excellence in diagnostic scopes.
- the creation of the Ontario Health Team Northumberland one of the first 24 government approved Ontario Health Teams. Comprised of a wide variety of local health care providers, Ontario Health Teams are the new planning and service delivery bodies tasked with creating seamless, patient centred local systems of care.
- the establishment of the inaugural Patient and Family Council to to enhance the "patient voice" and "patient experience" at CMH.
- a \$960,000 Ministry of Health capital grant to enhance safety and security infrastructure across the Hospital.
- a \$100,000 Ministry grant to replace the medical air system.
- an update of the hospital's redevelopment plans that were submitted to the Ministry of Health to advance the vision of an "integrated rural health hub on a campus of care".

However, by February 2020, usual hospital operations and future planning were overtaken by a new priority as Campbellford Memorial Hospital began the roll out of its pandemic plan to prepare for what was appearing to be a major public health threat.

Plans included taking stock of available personal protective equipment (PPE), initiating mock drills and deploying staff and processes to be ready for the possible arrival of a significant number of sick patients. By mid-March, the COVID-19 pandemic hit Ontario and life changed for health service providers and the public. Emergency Orders from Public Health Ontario stopped all non-essential services in hospitals. CMH began screening all patients and staff members, testing all suspect cases coming into the Emergency Department and the In-patient Unit and restricted visitors.

CMH like all other hospitals and health care providers has faced an unprecedented challenge in the final guarter of 2019/20. The response by the hospital, the staff and all other constituents of the hospital family have been nothing less than heroic and the hospital's continuing vigilance and adherence to provincial direction throughout the pandemic have paid off.

Unfortunately, many current and planned activities by the Auxiliary, the Volunteers and the Foundationhad to be postponed or cancelled. The hospital board has continued to meet virtually to ensure that the staff are supported through these challenging times.

We are eternally grateful to all of the staff who have continued to work with dedication and compassion even while putting themselves at potential risk and enduring personal inconvenience to ensure that the hospital continues to deliver its mission to "relieve illness, pain and suffering and promote the health of the communities we serve."




